Aynslee competed at the Olympia D'Artagnan's Challenge in the Unrated Y8 event and won a Bronze medal in her very first competition ever. Congratulations Aynslee!

Help Us Build Some Bathrooms by Steve Martin

SITS is planning to move to a larger space but will remain in the same building. The new space will house many more fencing strips and, not merely one, but two larger bathrooms with all new fixtures.

We are starting a fundraising campaign called "Build Better Bathrooms for SITS." Our goal is to raise \$12,000.00 for the bathrooms including all fixtures new and lighting. Any additional monies collected beyond the cost of the bathrooms will go toward paint

and plywood for the main hall.

We are on schedule to transfer classes to the new space this winter, but even after classes begin to meet there, finishing touches will continue until the new space is complete.

The completed space will allow SITS to host larger tournaments that will welcome more area competitive fencers. It will also allow our athletes both in classes and in open-fencing periods to enjoy more time on the strip. Please consider donating to this very worthy cause.

Which Connecticut Fencing Club is the Largest? by Steve Martin

As with most things, the Sword in the Scroll Fencing Academy had humble beginnings. A couple of decades ago, a group of us interested folk were active in a club called Western Swordsmanship Technique and Research (aka WSTR) where we studied German longsword techniques based on early written German manuscripts. In those days we would meet in area highschool gyms. A small number of us two-handed sword practitioners (not more than half a dozen) began to meet in a church fellowship hall on Saturday mornings to begin practicing competitive fencing techniques using the epee.

As interest in the SITS competitive fencing grew, both SITS and WSTR moved to our current rental space in Willimantic. Both groups are still using this space even though each has grown in numbers, and each has broadened its focus. SITS holds classes on Mondays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, and is open for adult free fencing on Tuesdays; and now has participants in all three competitive weapons. Meanwhile, the twohanded swordsmen hold their trainings on Wednesdays and they now study a wider range of historical handheld weapons.

SITS fencing has grown to a point that all five pistes are in heavy use for much of the week. And, according to recent statistics derived from USA Fencing, there are now nearly one hundred card-carrying fencers who claim SITS as their club. While there are several Connecticut fencing clubs of a similar size, SITS is now the largest fencing club in Connecticut. In order both to better accommodate our current fencers and to have room to continue growing, SITS has recently signed a lease for a larger space in the same building complex. Over the next few months, we will be working to prepare the new space and both clubs will be moving there.
